

Community

The Cornwall-Lebanon School District is located in the south-central part of Lebanon County, Pennsylvania, and completely encircles the city of Lebanon. We are composed of the townships of South Lebanon, North Cornwall, West Cornwall, and North Lebanon, in addition to the boroughs of Cornwall and Mount Gretna. The district consists of 70 square miles and is inhabited by more than 53,000 residents. A few large industries, many small businesses, and numerous family farming operations characterize the local economy.

School

Cedar Crest is a public, four-year, comprehensive high school with a total enrollment of approximately 1633. A faculty of 111 members provides instruction. The school year pattern is two semesters, each 90 days in length, with grades issued every nine (9) weeks.

Special Curriculum Features

Honors courses are offered in English, Social Studies, Mathematics, Science, World Language, and various electives in grades 9 through 12. Twenty Advanced Placement (AP) courses are available: AP Art History, AP Biology, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Chemistry, AP Computer Science A, AP Computer Science Principles, AP English-Language and Composition, AP English-Literature and Composition, AP Environmental Science, AP European History, AP Human Geography, AP Macroeconomics, AP Physics 1, AP Physics 2, AP Physics C, AP Psychology, AP Statistics, AP US Government, and AP US History.

College-level study is available through a number of post-secondary institutions, including but not limited to Harrisburg Area Community College, the University of Pittsburgh, Lebanon Valley College, Delaware Valley College, PA College of Health Sciences, and Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.

Students are able to attend the Lebanon County Career and Technology Center, which offers a variety of technical and career training programs.
