## Course Changes:

Life is full of challenges. School is no different. When considering a course change, Cedar Crest High School has a process that students should follow to assist them with persevering and building necessary skills to succeed in life.

- The student should talk to their parents/guardians for advice and encouragement
- The student should attempt to complete all assigned work
- The student should seek academic help from the teacher
- The student should seek academic assistance from other resources such as Falcon Academy, peer tutors, private tutors, etc.
- If the above steps have been followed, then the student may secure a “Request for Schedule Change” form from their counselor.
- The student will meet with the counselor for a review and schedule adjustment. In some cases, this request may need Mr. Groff’s review and consideration for approval.

## Smart Futures:

- Replacing the old Project LIFE course
- Required by ALL students to graduate from CCHS
- Each year provides career-exploration and career-readiness activities to help you plan and prepare for your future!
- Access Smart Futures through your Clever account
- Current 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will receive classroom instruction in the near future
- Your counselor can assist with any questions you have along the way related to the course or what you discover

## Advanced Placement Courses:

- Available in a variety of subjects → 20 courses offered
- Recommended by teachers and requires a **PINK** AP Application form → **Due 2/5/24**
- AP exam in May is required → Qualifying scores on the exam can lead to college credit
- Estimated cost of exam is \$98.00 and **is due by 11/1/24**
- If a course is both CHS and AP, students will have the choice between one or the other or both
- **Required: Grit and Growth Mindset**



## Dual Enrollment:

- Courses are taken at a post-secondary institution
- Courses count as both high school AND college credit
  - **FYI – Not all colleges will accept dual enrollment credit**
  - **Students are responsible for reaching out to potential colleges to see if credits will transfer**
- Only available to 12<sup>th</sup> grade students
- Must be pre-approved by Mr. Groff
- In the past, CCHS students have taken classes through HACC, LVC, PA College of Health Sciences, and Thaddeus Stevens

## College in the High School:

- Students can earn college credit while satisfying the requirements for a high school diploma
- PITT and HACC courses are offered at Cedar Crest and taught by CCHS teachers
- Students are required to pay fees for these courses to earn college credit → billed directly by college
- Payment is the responsibility of the student
- Students may take the courses and opt out of college credit

## Early Graduation:

- Available to 12<sup>th</sup> grade students in good academic standing
- Double-up on English semester 1 or pay for a summer class
- Must be pre-approved by Mr. Groff
- Allows students to graduate one semester early
- **Why choose Early Graduation?**
  - To start college or tech school early
  - To begin military career or training
  - To enter workforce early
- See your Counselor for an application and more information

## (Co-op) Supervised Business Partnership:

- Earn up to 4 credits while working in a paid position
- 3 or 4 periods a day → One or two semester options

## Future Professional's Internship:

- Earn 1 credit while interning in an unpaid position
- 2 periods a day → One semester

**You must register for a minimum of 6.0 credits  
in case plans change or you are not approved.**

*\*\*\*Both options are only available to 12<sup>th</sup> grade students\*\*\**

## Open Campus:

- Available to 12<sup>th</sup> grade students in good academic standing
- Seniors may register for 6.0 credits and come in late or leave school early → AM or PM options available
- **Open Campus will NOT be prioritized during the scheduling process. Original course selections for core and elective classes will take precedence!!!**
- Must provide your own transportation
- Register for Open Campus online and record it on your Course Registration Contract → If approved you will receive an Open Campus Privilege Form next school year

## EMT – Emergency Medical Technician:

- Rigorous yearlong course → 1 credit course
- Available to 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders who are 16 years old prior to April 1
- Earn an Emergency Medical Technician certification
- There is a fee (\$245 for the 2023-2024 school year)
- **Evening classes are required**
- HACCC will offer 6 credits for successful completion of program
- Mandatory informational meeting this spring

## Independent Study:

- Intended for students to learn about a specific topic in-depth that is not taught in other course offerings
- Graded with an O (Outstanding), S (Satisfactory), or U (Unsatisfactory)
- Available for a full-year or half-year
- Student must initiate contact with a teacher to serve as an instructor and develop the course objectives and description
- Must be approved by Mr. Groff
- Pick up an application at the Counseling Office

## Peer Tutor:

- Available to students in grades 10-12 in good academic standing (no less than a B in core or foreign language classes of CP level or higher on transcript)
- Serve as a Peer Tutor during a lunch period
- Earn credit (S, U grading) or service hours for NHS or Key Club, but not both in the same semester
- Does not count toward GPA calculation
- May register for half or full year
- Complete an application if interested



## Department Internship:

- 1 period per day for a half year OR full year
- O, S, U grading
- Only available at the high school
- Open to juniors and seniors
- Complete an application if interested
- One department intern per teacher per semester
- Not guaranteed...Core classes take precedence in the schedule
- Must give up Lunch or Open Campus to schedule

### Lebanon County Career and Technology Center (CTC):

- Two-year, half-day programs (junior/senior years)
  - 16 programs
- One-year, full-day programs (senior year)
  - 5 programs
- Cosmetology is half-day junior year and full-day senior year
- Students attend college/tech school, enter military, or go right into the workforce after CTC
- **Registration Deadline: March 1, 2024**
